Land for Sale!!

The City has residential, business and industrial lots for sale. Contact the City for information.

- Five (5) residential lots remain on Mueller Drive (King's Court Subdivision). Great locations near the hospital. Reduced pricing for those that qualify.
- Business lot available - The lot is on the NE corner of the Main St and Lincoln St.
- New Industrial lot(s) on East Railroad St. Great access for trucks from the County Road.

Nuisance Issues

If your yard has junk, unlicensed or inoperable vehicles, expect a letter from the City. Junk can comprise of: junk machinery, household appliances, automobile bodies, or other material creating fire, health, or safety hazards from such accumulation. Please take reasonable steps to clean up your yard and license or remove the junk vehicles. With the City-wide clean up, now is the time to clean up that yard. If you need help with anything, please give us a call.

Water Usage

You are responsible for the water that services your property. If you should have a leak you are still responsible for the water usage and all the related fees that go with the increased water usage. DO NOT FLUSH rags, wet wipes, rubber gloves, down the toilet. It can cause major problems with the City's sanitary sewer system.

Golf Car Owners

For those with golf cars, you must get a permit. Otherwise, it is against City AND State Law to drive your golf car in town. Obtaining a permit is very easy and inexpensive. Stop into the City office and it only takes a few minutes. Golf Cars must be insured. Golf Car Permit \$15.00. Renewal May 1 each year. The City's permit allows for access on County Road 17, west towards the golf course. The golf car must have a slow-moving vehicle sign and rearview mirror.

The following are ILLEGAL:

- **NO ONE under 16 is allowed to drive a golf car on any City street.**
- **To drive on State HWY 271 AKA Division St.; however you can cross at intersections.**
- **To drive after dark or during inclement weather when visibility is reduced. NOTE: Driving at night is allowable if the golf car has the original lighting equipment.**
- **To drive contrary to any traffic law of the City of Hendricks or the State of MN.**

General Information:

- Picnic Shelter/Band shell – call the City to reserve the picnic shelter or band shell.
- No Open Burning - The City does not allow open burning.
- Sump pumps MUST pump outside from March 15 to November 15
- Got Chickens??? You must get a permit to keep chickens on your property.

Tree PIT - Nominal fees apply to use the tree pit. Please stop into the City office to pay. Only branches that are 8" in diameter, or less, are allowed to be burned. It is required by the DNR to compost the leaves and grass clippings, so please put those in a separate pile as they will not be burned. **ABSOLUTELY NO PLASTIC BAGS, LUMBER, OR GARBAGE OF ANY TYPE.** General hours: Thursday afternoon through Sunday...If the gate is locked, do not dump debris over the fence.

Attention Pet Owners

Nuisances/Licenses - There continues to be incidents with loose/stray cats and dogs. If you just let your animal out and don't know where it goes, it is probably "going" on someone else's lawn. This is extremely disrespectful and against the law. We appreciate your cooperation and please be considerate to others and keep your dog or cat on your property or on a leash. All pets (Dogs/Cats) must be licensed. **PET LICENSE \$10.00, RENEWAL JUNE 1 EACH YEAR.** Please bring shot records. If your dog continually barks, this can be considered a nuisance especially during the night time hours. A citation may be warranted.

Vaccination Clinics 2022 - The Marshall Animal Clinic (Dr. Scott Kueker) will be holding an animal vaccination clinic at the Hendricks Fire Hall. They will be here May 26th, 4PM-6:30PM. Rabies, distemper, Heartgard, Interceptor Plus, Frontline, Nexgard & Revolution will be available. No Exams offered that day. Spring Clean-Up May 2, 2022

City Residents, we are once again, coming to you!! Get the **ALLOWABLE** materials to the curb and we will pick them up. Put everything out by **NO LATER** than May 2, 2022.

ALLOWABLE MATERIALS: (Please make separate piles)

- **Unwanted Household Items** chairs, tables, couches, carpet, misc. junk. Anything loose, must be in a bag (if it can fit in a garbage bag)
- **Appliances** dishwashers, dryers, furnaces, microwaves, water heaters, ovens, trash compactors, freezers, refrigerators, washers, water softeners, humidifiers, etc.
- **Electronics** computers/monitors, laptops, printers, copiers, tv's, VHS/DVD players
- **Mattresses/box springs** if you have a mattress, please call ahead. Do NOT leave them outside!!

There is no charge for normal household materials. \$7.00 Fees apply to appliances, electronics, mattresses, box springs and tires. If we pick them up, we will automatically charge them to your utility account.

We should not need a broom or rake to clean up your material. Any material that is not allowable or spilled all over, **WILL NOT BE PICKED UP!** If you are not sure about something, please give us a call.

Material we will NOT pick up:

- Piles of Demolition Material (call Southwest Sanitation regarding a dumpster)
- Leaves and Branches (please haul to Hendricks Burn Site (Tree Pit))
- Hazardous Waste; paint, chemicals light bulbs, etc. (See note below regarding Lincoln County Hazardous Drop off)

NOTE: Hazardous Household Waste can be dropped off at the Lincoln County Shop on E. Railroad Street on May 4th 9AM to 11AM. The City cannot pick up any hazardous waste.

Hendricks Businesses – Please coordinate with the public works crew on disposing of your items. Keeping in mind – no demolition materials.
